

COOCHIE COMMUNITY SHOPPING SERVICE (CCSS)

In 2000, a small group (approx 6) of residents identified the need of the elderly & disabled residents of Coochie trying to get their fortnightly (pension week) shopping back to their homes in all weather via the bus & ferry. This group formed the "Coochie Community Co-Op Service" with the assistance of residents John Lamb & later Max Gilmore. The "Co-OP" was able to use their vehicles, at no charge, to carry out this voluntary work. When John Lamb moved off the Island, the COOCHIEMUDLO ISLAND SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB offered the use of their vehicle, again at no charge, to help with deliveries.

During the latter part of 2005, Max Gilmore moved off the Island and sold his Nissan Panel Van to the "Co-Op" for \$1,500. This money was raised from donations, raffles etc, by the community of Coochiemudlo Island who did not want the service closed. As the need for this service increased, it was realised that the volunteers were not covered by any form of insurance. Following legal advice the "Co-OP" was closed in June 2006 and reformed in July 2006, under its present name, an incorporated Association with the necessary insurance coverage. A Committee was elected to administer this service. All committee persons and volunteers give their service without any form of payment, simply to assist the less able residents live in a caring community.

During the latter part of 2008, the well worn nissan panel van was replaced with a larger van, thanks to receiving a QLD Government gaming services grant. The function of the Shopping Service is to collect members' shopping from the Victoria Point Shopping Service (at the Bi-Lo & Woolworths Supermarkets) on the Wednesday & Friday of each aged pension fortnight. When the members have completed their shopping, volunteers pack the shopping in boxes, load them on the delivery van and deliver to members' homes on Coochie.

Each household pays \$5 delivery fees per shopping day. This contribution helps toward the barge fees, vehicle upkeep, fuel, volunteer insurance costs and vehicle registration. These fees fall well short of maintaining the service and are helped by the Friday night raffles at the jetty as well as two of the market day stalls. These raffles and stalls are the financial "LIFE BLOOD", which maintains the operation of this service/

Members eligible to use this service should be aged or disabled residents of Coochiemudlo Island. Currently there are some vacancies for membership, residents interested should contact Secretary, Jack Morganti on 3207 9245.

Coochie Talks Vision and Planning session Sunday, 28 June

35 – 40 people turned out on a sunny morning for the “Coochie Talks” Vision & Planning session at the Rec Club. We started the morning with a pancake and French toast breakfast, kindly provided by Bev & Don Holcroft and a sausage sizzle organised by Carolyn Brammer. Kevin Child, our facilitator for the day, then kicked us off and encouraged everyone to spend some time looking through the 30 survey responses received before the day, we used these, the vision from 2002, the collage developed last year and the Redlands Community Vision as a strong platform to start a conversation about our vision for Coochie. Each of the tables came back with some great ideas about what we'd like the island to be like in 2019, key themes we agreed need to be worked on to get there included, Community Spirit, Youth, The Environment and our Facilities & Amenities. Each of the tables then spent time brainstorming ideas for work we could do around each of these themes, the top 3 ideas were chosen by each table and all 12 were voted on to give us our top priorities.

The top 4 ideas from the day included

1. Create a youth sub committee of Progress.
2. Improve access to the jetties and improve their appearance.
3. Islanders to become part of the management of our natural environment through dialogue with council.
4. Create a sustainability centre at the tip for recyclable goods.

FROM THE GOLF CLUB...

Our annual championships and foursome championships are now over, and the winners and runners up for the gross, net and foursomes competitions will be announced and presented at our annual dinner on the Friday, 14 August. This will be held at the Matthew Flinders Café.



The winter work on the course continues and this winter we will be extending the 2nd tee. This exercise will allow a different and more interesting position for the second and eleventh tee—hit offs. It is intended that some of the other smaller tees will be enlarged also – time and money permitting.

Annual fees are now due and we ask all those members who have not paid their subs to kindly do so. It is heartening to find that we have kept many of our new memberships.

Junior golf is continuing and increasing in numbers. Ages of the children range from 6 to 14 years and they are all keen to learn. Thanks to Ray Burton and Norman Archibald who conduct these sessions fortnightly on Saturdays. A notice appears on the notice board prior to the Saturday – so watch this space.

We have completed an application to the Community Benefit Fund for funding for our fencing, some signage and banded areas. We would like to thank the organisations on the island who so kindly supported our application with a letter of support. Time will tell if we have received any funding either in part or full.

We have completed our draft strategic plan as well as a code of conduct and its procedures. All these documents will be available to members and it is hoped that by the AGM at the end of August, we will have a complete manual for the club maintenance and organisation. This will enable future committees to continue the good work on and off the course and allow a smooth management process to achieve our aims for the future.

FISHY BITS ...

It has been an interesting month. As the warm weather gave it's last gasp, the yellow fin pike were hitting everything that moved; even dragging a soft plastic across the top of the water in some places on the bay (eg: the southern end of goat island), would make the pike literally jump out of the water to attack.



A few late spotty mackerel were caught between Macleay island, and Peel before the cold weather really hit - sizes were generally small to medium; hints of surface activity north of Coochie proved to be Watsons leaping bonito, or very small tuna - very hard to chase down, as they don't tend to stay on the surface for long, and are very wary of boat noise.

Snapper have arrived in reasonable numbers, though the sizes are still generally small - mid 40cm fish are reasonably common, but the 50's and 60's of last year are a little harder to track down. The north side of peel, and the southern arc of goat/bird have produced reasonable results so far.

With the colder weather though, the flounder have woken up. The eastern side of the island, right up to the Banana banks, are producing consistent numbers of fish. Try nippers, beach worms, or small gulp swimmer mullet soft-plastics, (2 inch, nuclear chicken). The fish are often quite aggressive, and put up a fight that belies their generally thin composition. The front of the island, on the opposite side of the ferry channel, is also worth a shot on higher tides.

Winter whiting have hit the island, and are biting reasonably well in some places. Although east of the jetty is worth a try, the most consistent location at the moment has to be red rock, out in front of the submarine cable sign. Yabbies are the most consistent option at this point in time.

The creeks are still producing fish at the moment - reports of a 78cm flathead caught (and released) in Erapah have filtered in, and there have been some good sized tailor caught also. The fish are a little sleepy at the moment, so if you're using artificials, make sure that the plastic, or lure, goes VERY slow - and target the banks that have been in sunshine for a little while - you might find something basking.

The bass have started schooling in Wivenhoe, though catches have been fairly rare - in another month or so when the weather warms up a little, should bring the fish on the bite.

Meanwhile, those with a taste for garfish should be able to scare up a feed by burlying up with bread on the northern side of the island just after a high tide, and either use very small hooks baited with bread or cheese balls, or a cast net.

COOCHIE HISTORY

Two books, '*Tides of Change*' and '*The Next Wave*' tell the story of Queensland's early pioneers. With the structure of a novel, they make interesting reading. The story of early Moreton Bay is told through the lives of a family and their friends and is centred around the southern islands of the Bay and adjacent mainland. Some of the worst tragedies along the coast are recorded, the important mineral discoveries and the social and politics at the time make interesting reading.

'*Tides of Change*' takes the reader through to 1910. '*The Next Wave*' covers the years of great change to the lives of early settlers, a lot having to do with the breakthrough of the Pacific Ocean, which gave us both north and south Stradbroke Islands. This book shows how the island communities grew and coped with great difficulties of WWI and WWII. Between those times there was the Great Depression and how the large families of those times survived. This book goes to 1950.

What happens when 000 is called? -

Ambulance Scenario

 EMERGENCY SERVICES

 CALLER

 TWO SIMULTANEOUS STEPS

In an emergency, a bystander calls the emergency number 000. A Telstra operator asks which town & state they are calling from, and which service is required - Police, Fire, or Ambulance. Caller requests Ambulance and is immediately transferred.

Ambulance call taker receives call, and will ask these questions:
Where is the emergency? What phone number are you calling from? What is the problem (tell me what happened)? How many are injured? Are they conscious? Are they breathing?

Call taker advises the caller that an ambulance is being dispatched, and sends information to the dispatcher. This is done either automatically by computer system, or manually by the call taker.



Details are given to dispatcher. Dispatcher makes decision on the most appropriate unit to respond. Ambulance is dispatched.



Call taker asks caller additional questions to determine what first aid advice is needed, and any other information needed by the crew, ie landmarks.



The responding Ambulance crew is kept informed of any new information about the emergency.



Appropriate first aid advice is given to caller. A caller should never hang up until instructed to do so by the call taker.



In some circumstances, such as a cardiac arrest, the call taker stays online to give directions and encouragement until the ambulance arrives.



Ambulance arrives at scene.
